APRIL IS COQUI AWARENESS MONTH

Hualālai has been making great progress to control the spread of coqui frogs. These non-native invasive pests disturb members and guests and can adversely impact property values if not adequately controlled. In cooperation with the Hualālai Community Association (HCA), homeowners, vendors and property managers, we are uniting to raise awareness about coqui frogs as we head into the warmer summer months. By working together, we can make Hualālai more peaceful for members and guests.

Top 3 Measures for Effective Coqui Control

1. Inspect & Treat: Citric Acid, Steaming, Quarantining or Sodium Bicarbonate should be used to treat all incoming plants to the Resort. Citric acid and steaming seem to be the most effective.
2. Eliminate Coqui Habitats: Coqui will hide in debris piles, rock walls and thick bushes near ground level during the day – anywhere that is moist. Pay close attention to these areas to remove hiding places and also to open up so that they can be treated by the resort coqui team. If areas are not ready for treatment, the team will move on to the next property rather than waste time and materials.
3. Awareness: If you detect coqui (hear them or see them), please notify the property manager or homeowner so that they may alert the HCA and/or arrange spot treatment. The HCA conducts regularly scheduled coqui control so it may take some time for them to visit the property.

Coqui Hot Spots

There are several focus areas in the residences that we want to bring to your attention. If you work on properties near these hot spots, please be extra vigilant and employ aggressive coqui mitigation efforts to contain the problem.
